NHS England requires that net earnings of doctors engaged in the practice are publicised, and the required disclosure is shown below.

However, it should be noted that the prescribed method for calculating earnings is potentially misleading because it takes no account of how much time doctors spend working in the practice, and should not be used to form any judgment about GP earnings, or to make any comparison with any other practice.

All GP practices are required to declare the mean earnings (average Pay) for GP's working to deliver NHS services to patients at each practice.

The average pay for GP's working in St Stephens Surgery and our associated practice Maple View Medical Centre in the last financial year 2015/16 was £49,128 before tax and National Insurance.

This is for a 6 full-time GP's, 8 part-time GP's, and 3 locum GP's who worked in the practice for more than 6 months.
